EARLY CHILDHOOD PROGRAMS

Our early childhood programs focus on providing a learning experience where all needs of our children are addressed. We promote creativity, self-identity and cooperation. Our three-year-olds attend morning sessions on Monday and Wednesday, or Tuesday and Thursday. Four-year-olds may enroll in either a half-day or full-day program, Monday, Wednesday and Friday, providing a smooth transition into kindergarten.

EXTENDED CARE

Extended care is available before school begins from 7-8 a.m., Monday through Friday. After-school extended care is available Monday through Thursday, 2:55-6 p.m., and Friday from 2:55-5:30 p.m.
