Religion - In Chapter 9 "Jesus Teaches Us to Pray" the students learned that prayer is talking to and listening to God. We discussed how there are two types of prayers: formal and personal. That a formal prayer is a prayer that all Catholics know and that a personal prayer is when we ask God for something we want or need.

We discussed how the Lord's Prayer is the prayer that Jesus taught his followers to pray to God the Father.
The students are learning the "Our Father."

Reading/Language Arts -


In Foundations we continued to work on the concept of suffix -s as in bugs /z/ and in shops /s/. We discussed what a base word is and how to mark it. We underline a base word and circle the suffix. Our spelling test will be on Monday, November 23rd.

Math - We started Chapter 3: Unknown Numbers in Addition and Subtraction. They learned that when you solve a story problem you need three to show three things: how you solved it, the unknown answer and the label.

Science/Social Studies/Health - We are learning about the Pilgrims' trip from England on the Mayflower and we discussed their hardships and how they worked together with the Native Americans.

We discussed how God watched over them, just as he watches over us and that God wants all of us to work together to solve our problems.

Did you know that there were two ships that set sail to America? Ask your child what the name was of the sister ship that sailed with the Mayflower but had to turn back twice because it developed leaks?
